In the course "Interpretation of the New Testament - the Gospel according to John", Assoc. Dr. Parush Parushev presented an exegetical-hermeneutic analysis and theological review of the structure, style, figurative world and the main theological themes of the Gospel of John and connected this with an overview of the historical, political, cultural and the religious context in which the gospel was written.



In the course "Introduction to Hermeneutics", Dr. Daniel Patterson prepared students to:

- Be able to assess why and how "location" influences the interpretation of biblical texts.
- Explain the difference between hermeneutics and exegesis.
- Gain an understanding of the history of interpretation.
- Take into account the historical-cultural background, literary characteristics and genre when
